- -Pour a pot of boiling water onto the adhesive and wait five minutes. Gently remove the stick pair of tongs.
- -Apply a coat of clear nail polish over the sticker and wait a few minutes. Peel off the polish.
- -Peel the sticker off slowly using a vegetable peeler.
- -Scrape off the sticker with a spatula.
